Customer Information RoHS Regulation ((EU) 2011/65 or 2015/863)

The above-mentioned regulations serve to restrict the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical or electronic equipment. If you manufacture products for other industry segments with our material, the RoHS directive does not apply.

Our products comply with the RoHS Directive, which permits the following alloys, among others (non-exhaustive list)

- Lead as an alloying element of steel with a content of up to 0.35 percent by weight. All free-cutting steels in our range meet this requirement.
- Lead as an alloying element of copper with a content of up to 4 percent by weight. All bronze alloys in our range meet these requirements with the following exception: the material CuSn7ZnPb (2.1090) contains an average of 6% lead.
- For material CuSn7ZnPb, the provision applies that the use of lead in lead bronze bearing shells and bushes is permissible. Accordingly, this material may only be used for leadbronze bearing shells and bushes in the industrial segment of electrical and electronic equipment affected by the RoHS Regulation.
